Favorite fall activity (trick or treating, football, apple picking, hayrides, playing in leaves etc.)


Favorite fall food (pumpkin pie, squash, sweet potatoes, apples, etc.)

Favorite fall holiday (Columbus Day, Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, etc.)

Rubric

P (100)	Poster clearly displays fall favorites and things that occur during the season. Poster is neat and contains pictures. Clear evidence the student helped with project (handwriting, tracing, coloring, glue, etc.). Student can talk about their poster and how they helped create it.
I (75)	Poster clearly displays fall favorites and things that occur during the season. Poster is not neat or does not contain pictures. Some evidence the student helped with project (handwriting, tracing, coloring, glue, etc.). Student can talk about their poster and how they helped create it.
N (50 or below)	Poster does not contain fall related themes or poster is not neat. Does not contain pictures. No evidence the student helped with project (handwriting, tracing, coloring, glue, etc.). Student cannot talk about their project or tell how they helped create it.



Ways to Have Your Child Help with their Project

- Include pictures to color
- Ask your child what they want to say and write it for them
- Write with a highlighter and have them trace it with a pencil or marker
- Let your child draw a picture on the poster and label it
- Let your child cut the pictures out of a magazine
- Let your child glue pictures down
- Allow your child to add stickers or other decorations
